

Working with Military Members 101 E-Learning Course

Overview

In this two-hour video course, expert speakers discuss working with members of the military and their families. By the end of this training, participants will gain an understanding of how to work with military members, veterans, and families of military members. Topic covered include: Military Culture 101; Ethics and the Military; and, Military Members and their Families.

Objectives

- Recognize moral injury and its consequences in military veterans.

- Compare and contrast military culture, organizational structure, ranks, terminology, and core values of the various branches of service.
- Describe the military ethos and its impact on the building of relationships and providing healthcare to veterans and their families.
- Describe general military deployment-related stressors and the stages of deployment cycles and reintegration for veterans and families.
- Discuss the challenges encountered in coping with residual physical and mental health disorders post-deployment for veterans and their families.
