



Contraceptive Provision in Oregon School-Based Health Centers: Time Trends, Disparities, and the Role of Title X

Description:

This research identifies how multilevel factors (woman-level, clinic-level, and woman's residence-level) influence access, quality, and utilization and drive differences in effective contraception use.

Objectives:

- Compare how provision of contraceptive methods has changed over time for adolescents in Oregon's school-based and community health centers
- Describe racial and ethnic disparities in adolescent contraception in Oregon's SBHCs and CHCs
- Identify the role that the Title X program plays in provision of the most effective contraceptive methods in Oregon
