Implementing Quality Family Planning for Training of the Trainers

Provided by the UMKC School of Nursing and Health Studies, National Clinical Training Center for Family Planning

Event Description:

This eight-hour training is an interactive and comprehensive educational activity designed for reproductive health professionals for delivery and resource provision within the Title X network. The curriculum consists of three modules: Basic Contraception, Advanced Contraception, and Shared Decision Making in Contraceptive Education and Choice. The first module is a recorded two-hour online training with a knowledge check, and the six-hour live virtual training consists of an overview of the first module and in-depth discussion of the second two modules with adult learning best practices and training methodology.

Training Objectives:

HealthKnowledge Module 1- Pre-Course Online Training

- ✧ Identify steps involved in screening all clients for pregnancy desires and/or reproductive plan
- ✧ Describe to clients essential characteristics about contraceptive methods such as mode of use, effectiveness and side effects
- ✧ Determine when and how to provide contraceptive counseling and services to all clients wishing to prevent pregnancy using a client-centered, culturally, linguistically, and age appropriate approach

Live (Virtual) Training Objectives

- ✧ Identify steps involved in screening all clients for pregnancy desires and/or reproductive plan
- ✧ Describe to clients essential characteristics about contraceptive methods such as mode of use, effectiveness and side effects
- ✧ Determine when and how to provide contraceptive counseling and services to all clients wishing to prevent pregnancy using a client-centered, culturally, linguistically, and age appropriate approach
- ✧ Describe a model a clinician needs to follow to provide person-centered care and shared decision making for contraceptive choice
- ✧ Describe correct use of the full range of medically approved contraceptive methods
- ✧ Demonstrate ability to present combined and integrated module materials (slides, hand-outs, and role-play) to deliver IQFP training using adult learning principles
- ✧ List at least two methods of providing the training to network

Successful Completion:

Participants must complete the online pre-recorded module (2 contact hours) and the live virtual six (6) hour training. To receive contact hours, participants must complete the online portion of the course with a satisfactory grade of 80% or higher on the knowledge check, attend the live six (6) hour training in its entirety, submit an example training video for feedback, and complete the Evaluation/Request for Credit form. Certificates will be emailed within four-six weeks of submission of the video.
