Description:

The 4-hour, self-paced Tour of Motivational Interviewing (MI) online training defines the "Spirit of Motivational Interviewing" and examines its evidence-base. The Spirit of MI is essential to delivering an effective MI-based brief intervention. Future modules will review the steps and techniques of MI which are parallel to the brief intervention; this module reviews the basic concepts of MI and explores the importance of building a relationship with the client that is built on respect, empathy, trust, autonomy, and compassion.

Successful Completion:

Participants must complete the self-paced Tour of Motivational Interviewing online training and complete the training with a satisfactory grade of 80% or higher on the quiz. This Tour of MI training will help prepare you and the other participating staff for the SAT2HIV Project's 12-hour live virtual workshop.
