- Identify the guiding principles for fertility awareness-based method use.
- Explain the menstrual cycle, including the observable biomarkers or fertility indicators associated with hormonal fluctuations.
- Describe strategies people can use to monitor biomarkers of fertility.
- Apply client-centered counseling strategies to educate clients about fertility awareness-based methods.
