Description:

A one-hour webinar with Pam Glenn, CNM, discussing the issue of human trafficking, the signs that a patient may be in a trafficking situation, and steps clinicians can take to implement human trafficking screening in their own practices..

Objectives:

- Identify the most common forms of marijuana that adolescents are using
- List at least three strategies used by traffickers to recruit and control their victims.
- Describe at least three physical and three psychological signs of human trafficking.
- List at least three "red flags" alerting them that a patient may be in a trafficking situation.
- Articulate at least three appropriate screening questions.
- Identify at least three concrete steps they can take to implement screening protocols in their work setting, emphasizing the collaboration required with other professionals involved in this issue.
