



Early Pregnancy Diagnosis and Dating Virtual Coffee Break

Even Description:

This virtual coffee break was created by the National Clinical Training Center for Family Planning to describe the process for diagnosing a pregnancy and determining gestational age. It is intended for Title X program clinical providers (MD/NP/PA/CNM), nurses, and other staff who provide pregnancy testing and counseling to clients.

Objectives:

- List the types of pregnancy tests and their uses based on their human chorionic gonadotropin (hCG) measurements and thresholds.
- Describe the process of determining gestational age.
- Discuss additional considerations for determining gestational age outside of the typical 28-day menstrual cycle.
- Identify the actions necessary for evaluating and counseling a client with a positive pregnancy test.
