

Follow-Up and Complications After Early Pregnancy Loss Virtual Coffee Break

Even Description:

This virtual coffee break was created by the Clinical Training Center for Sexual and Reproductive Health to help providers diagnose, counsel, and treat clients with nonviable intrauterine pregnancy. It is intended for Title X program clinical providers (MD/NP/PA/CNM), nurses, and other staff who may treat clients after early pregnancy loss.

Objectives:

- Identify the key components of early pregnancy loss follow up care.
- Recognize potential complications and triage to the appropriate level of care.
- Formulate a follow-up plan after early pregnancy loss.
- Develop a contraceptive plan with the client, if desired.
- Describe the importance of non-judgmental and confidential care for clients seeking care after experiencing early pregnancy loss.
