Description:

This virtual training will offer learners tools and strategies to support and deliver trauma-informed services. A universal approach to understanding and addressing current and past trauma is important to build trust with patients, avoid retraumatization, and enhance reproductive well-being. This training includes videos, interactive exercises, knowledge checks, downloadable job aids, and links to other helpful tools and resources.

Objectives:

After this course, participants will be able to:

- Discuss the prevalence and effects of trauma on clients and the health care team.
- Explain the trauma-informed model of care and how to implement it across all levels of practice.
- Demonstrate individual interaction strategies for avoiding stigmatization and re-traumatization.
- Implement trauma-informed clinical practices.
- Recommend trauma-informed practices, policies, and physical environment considerations.
